School Council Survey Summary

Thank you to the parents who attended our recent School Council meeting and took the time to complete our feedback surveys. Your voice is an important part of our continuous improvement process, and we truly value your thoughtful engagement.

At the meeting, participants were invited to complete two short surveys:

- 2025–2026 School Development Plan and Fees Feedback
- School Planning Meeting Evaluation

1. School Development Plan & Fees Feedback

Eight participants completed this survey.

School Development Plan:

- 100% agreed that their child's learning can benefit from the goals, outcomes, actions, and resources in the School Development Plan.
- 100% agreed that the learning of all students is reflected and prioritized in the plan.

This strong affirmation suggests that families see alignment between our planning priorities and student learning needs.

Activities and School Fees:

- 100% agreed that the activities provided are important for their child's learning.
- 100% agreed that school fees are reasonable considering the benefit they provide.

Activities/Services – How Participants Ranked Priorities

Participants were asked to rank a set of activities and services in order of importance, recognizing that schools must operate within a budget and that fees can be challenging for families.

Overall, the priorities ranked in this order:

1. Off-site field trips (highest priority)
2. Technology (student laptops/iPads)
3. Sport-related multi-day residencies
4. Arts/Culture-related multi-day residencies
5. In-class guest speakers
6. Whole-school performances (music/drama) (lowest priority)

What this tells us: When participants are asked to make trade-off decisions, they place the strongest value on learning experiences that extend beyond the classroom and on technology that supports daily learning. Enrichment opportunities such as residencies, guest speakers, and performances are still appreciated, but were ranked lower when compared directly against other priorities.

2. School Planning Meeting Evaluation

Six participants completed the meeting feedback survey.

Overall responses were very positive:

- 100% agreed or strongly agreed that the meeting provided useful information.
- 100% agreed or strongly agreed that they understand the planning work schools do to improve and support student learning.
- 100% agreed or strongly agreed that they felt encouraged to share their thoughts and feedback.
- 83% strongly agreed and 17% agreed that presenters were easy to understand.
- 100% agreed or strongly agreed that visual content was clear and that enough time was provided to read and process information.

Open-ended comments highlighted appreciation for transparency, clear explanations, strong planning, and the positive tone of the presentation.

What this tells us: Participants who attended felt informed, welcomed into the conversation, and confident in the direction of the school's work.

We are grateful for the strong support expressed through these surveys. Your feedback affirms confidence in our School Development Plan, appreciation for meaningful enrichment opportunities, and support for the responsible use of school resources.

As always, feedback is welcomed at any time. Our commitment remains the same: to plan thoughtfully, communicate transparently, and ensure that all decisions reflect what is best for student learning.
